Welcome to our fourth One Minute Play Festival! The plays you will be seeing were chosen from over 400 submissions from around the world and are distinctive and wide ranging. The One Minute Play format offers a unique opportunity to the cast, writers, directors, and producers. Contrary to the current administration and political atmosphere, The Decameron Project focuses on bringing diversity to the theatre, giving voice to the community, and offering inclusiveness to all who find home in the arts.

**The Decameron Project started in June 2020** when we knew that the Covid pandemic was going to inhibit live performances everywhere. We were determined, however, to continue to create theatre and have been meeting online weekly ever since. In 2023 we were able to offer live performances in Burbank, California.

We enjoyed a spectacular Tokyo premiere at Sooo Dramatic! In November, 2024. This year, we started our 2025 season with a first-time ever festival in Ventura, California where we performed at the Namba Performing Arts Space and honored founder Ben Bunji Namba, who migrated from Japan after World War II. This was also the first time I produced a festival remotely from Tokyo, and I want to thank and acknowledge all our US team members for making it happen.

This year's LA show at the Whitefire Theater features 50 new plays! The Decameron Project returns to Tokyo in November 2025 and plans for a third LA show in Spring of 2026.

I am personally grateful to all the writers, directors, and actors who have been so gracious with their time and energy. Some of these talented friends have been working with me for over 30 years! YES...that means since I was 5 years old!

Thank you all for supporting the Decameron Project's vision of creativity, inclusiveness, and diversity.



# **Playwrights:**

AJ Layague (she/her/hers) (Playwright - *Next in Line*) is an award-winning Filipino American composer/playwright with degrees from Stanford University (BA), CalArts (MFA), and UC San Diego (PhD). She studied playwriting at the David Henry Hwang Writers Institute at East West Players in Los Angeles. She was a 2023 Puffin Foundation Artist, a four-time semi-finalist for the Eugene O'Neill Music Theater Conference, and premiered new work (in rhyming verse) at the 2025 Red Bull Theater Short New Play Festival and the 2023 PanAsian NuWorks Festival in NYC. Her play *Cowgirl Katarungan's Recipe for Adobo* received a 2022 Finalist Prize in the Frank Moffett Mosier Fellowship for Works in Heightened Language Competition at Synecdoche Works as well as a 2023 Larking House Theatre workshop and reading, and was a finalist for the 2024 Judith Royce Award for Excellence in Playwriting, and a semi-finalist for the 2023 O'Neill National Playwrights Conference. It will be presented at Curtis Theatre in Brea, CA in May 2026. She has also been part of the writers cohorts at Circle X Theatre (Los Angeles) and Ensemble Studio Theatre LA. Her single-author musical *Lucy Larcom* won the 2024 Parlando New Musical Project and had a staged reading in Boulder in 2024.

**Alex Dremann** (Playwright - *Ryan's Tooth*) is a Philadelphia based playwright who studied playwriting at the University of Southern California and has had more than 500 productions of his short plays. Full lengths include: "Split Pea Pod" (The Brick Playhouse), "Postcoital Variations" (Philadelphia Theatre Workshop), "The :nv:s:ble Play" (Theatre of NOTE) and "The Cure" (Dayton Playhouse). Evenings of his collected short plays include: "Slap Happy" (Madlab Theatre), "Bipolar by Thursday" (Theatre Neo) and "13 Lemonade Ave." (Secret Room Theatre). Arthur M. Jolly (Playwright - *Ex Ghost*). Arthur M. Jolly (*he/him*) shares the standard writer background of starting in the NY film industry as a stunt performer, special effects artist and snake wrangler; then becoming a helicopter pilot instructing for the US Army in Fort Rucker, Alabama; and later flying tourists from Las Vegas into the Grand Canyon. Given such a predictable trajectory, his decision to quit flying and move to Los Angeles to write is all too familiar. Jolly was recognized by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences with a *Nicholl Fellowship in Screenwriting*. Feature films include *Where We Disappear* on Amazon Prime. As the playwright of 75 produced plays, Jolly won the *Todd McNerney National Playwriting Award*, the *Region IV David Mark Cohen Playwriting Award*, and was a finalist for the inaugural *Woodward/Newman Drama Award*. Published works include *A Gulag Mouse*, *The Ithaca Ladies Read Medea*, *The Lady Demands Satisfaction*, *Long Joan Silver*, *Mrs. Dilber's Christmas Carol*, *Past Curfew*, *Rising*, *There Is No Play*, *Trash* and two collections of short plays *Guilty Moments* and *Thin Lines*.

**Christian Simonsen** (Playwright - *Groundhog Day*) is a playwright, screenwriter and actor based in San Francisco. His stage plays have been performed in cities across the USA, as well as overseas in Sydney, Seoul, Oxford, and London (he loves that he gets to use an Oxford Comma after the word "Oxford"!) Christian currently writes for the sketch comedy group "Killing My Lobster."

Clyde James Aragon (Playwright - *I'm Your Huckleberry*) is from Albuquerque, New Mexico. His published prose humor has appeared in national and southwestern newspapers and magazines. He has published the books: *Tales of Delight and Shame*, humorous stories; *The PC Affair – a comic mystery of murder, mayhem, and data processing,* a detective novel; and *Abandon All Hope! - cheerful humor for impossible days*, humorous stories. His short plays *The Translated Works of Stephen Watts Kearny And His Army Of The West, Shakespeare's Wife, Pirate Bitches of the Caribbean, The Coroner, Gila Monster Man To The Rescue;* full-length play, *Hotel De Fools*; and radio play, *Blackbeard's Tuna*, have been performed publicly. He has also produced greeting card material and composed crossword puzzles. His filmography (all shorts): *Doctor Time Travel To The Rescue, The Accidental Canine – the story of Sheila, the dog who influenced art, The Gods of Beer, Frankenstein of the Americas, and <i>The Zombie National Guard – America's final defense against supernatural chaos*, and *Crime and Philosophy.* 

**David Malouf** (Playwright - *Cindy and Dave Drive Home from a Party*) is a retired educator who has written and directed prize-winning short films and stage plays. His plays *Waiting for Go, Troll, What Say You Boson Q, Street Fight* and *The Death of Boson X* have been presented by Players Theatre in NYC, SOOP Theatre in Pelham NY, North Port Plays in NY, Equity Theater in NYC, and Silver Spring Stage in MD. Awards include best script and best play for *The Death of Boson X*, Best play (tied) for *Street Fight,* and audience choice awards for three other plays.

David Simpatico's (Playwright - *Practice Makes Perfect*) career highlights include: the book/stage adaptation of *Disney's High School Musical, and* his musical adaptation of *Twelve Angry Men,* music and lyrics by Michael Holland, which received its world premiere production in June, 2022 at Theater Latte Da in Minneapolis, directed by Peter Rothstein. His grand opera, *The Life and Death(s) of Alan Turing,* with music by Justine F. Chen, received its world premiere at Chicago Opera Theater in March, 2023, also directed by Peter Rothstein.
